

**NORTH BAY POLICE SERVICES BOARD
POLICIES-ADEQUACY STANDARDS REGULATION
POLICY BY-LAW 2001-03**

Whereas section 31 of the Police Services Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.p. 15 sets out that the Board is responsible for the provision of adequate and effective policing and the members of the Police Service, through the Chief of Police are subject to the government of the Board and shall obey its lawful directions; and

That Section 4 of the Police Services Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.p. 15 sets out the six core areas of policing are Crime Prevention, Law Enforcement, Victims Assistance, Public Order Maintenance, Emergency Response, and Administration and Infrastructure; and

That the Board is bound by Ontario Regulation 3/99 regulating the Adequacy and Effectiveness of Police Services to establish policies in the six core areas of police service.

Therefore in accordance with the Regulation and subject to the following, the North Bay Police Services Board enacts this By-Law as Board Policies for as follows:

1. The attached policies set out in schedules 1 to 9 inclusive, to this By-Law:
 1. Suspect Apprehension Pursuits
 2. Emergency Planning
 3. Equal Opportunity, Discrimination, and Workplace Harassment
 4. Communicable Diseases
 5. Management of Police Records
 6. Marked General Patrol Vehicles
 7. Safe Storage of Police Service Firearms
 8. Police Uniforms
 9. Sex Offender Registry

are hereby adopted as Board Policies.

2. Notwithstanding the foregoing each policy is subject to amendment by resolution of the Board.
3. These policies are subject of the provision of an adequate annual operating budget to enable the Chief of Police to plan for the deployment of personnel and resources, and the absence of any other intervening factors that may frustrate the ability of the Chief of Police to implement these policies.
